

George Drach '58

George Drach is a 1953 initiate of Phi Gamma Delta. George made may significant contributions to Phi Gamma Delta both during and after his college years. His list of contributions include the Corresponding Secretary for Upsilon Alpha, study hall organizer and mentor, house boy for Fiji and the Kappa House and also was the deacon who encouraged Brothers to pray. He was also in Sophos, Chain Gang and Bobcats, and was the U of AZ 1956-57 Student Body President.

Not only was Brother Drach a valuable member in Phi Gamma Delta, his post college career is monumental. After graduating from the University of Arizona, George received his medical degree from Western Reserve University, Cleveland, Ohio in 1961. He started surgical training for two years and then entered the Navy and served active duty for two years. After serving our country, George jumped back into his medical career and completed one year of fellowship and three years of urology residency. If that isn't impressive enough, Brother Drach is the author of over 160 journal articles, 37 book chapters and 6 books or monographs. He has conducted major research in urinary stone disease, urinary and prostatic infections, the mechanics of urinary flow change with aging, and geriatric urology. He received the honor of "Father of American Lithotripsy," a kidney stone treatment.

His leadership track record is impeccable as demonstrated by his service as president for six organizations including Western Section American Urological Association (AUA), the American Board of Urology, the Residency Review Committee for Urology and more. Through these organizations he has received multiple awards and recognitions. For example, George was awarded the AUA Hugh Hampton Young for outstanding contributions to American urology, the AUA Certificate of Lifetime Achievement award and the AUA Research Innovator award.

George is still active as Past Chairman of the Section on Surgery for the American Geriatrics Society and as a Consultant in policies on Geriatric Surgical Education.

Brother Drach honors Fiji for the development of his transition from a busy teenager into a studious college graduate. When in the Tucson area, George's main contacts are his Fiji brothers.



Rick Allen '62

Initiated into Phi Gamma Delta at Psi Chapter at Wabash College, Brother Allen transferred to the University of Arizona as a sophomore in 1959, where he was immediately welcomed and embraced by his new Brothers and soon received his nickname, Rollaway.

Rick served as float chairman one of his junior years and as Treasurer his senior year. He also has the distinction of being "the only Brother ever to be removed from the Fiji serenade choir by John Ingersoll, Director."

Rick is currently President and owner, with wife Heidi, of Heidrick-Allen,Inc.,a lamp and lampshade fabrication company in Leawood, Kansas. Previously, he was the retail sales manager of a plastic fabrication company in Kansas City, Mo. He and Heidi owned and operated, for 18 years, The Back Burner, a cookware store and cooking school, acclaimed in 1983 as one of the top 25 cooking schools in the US by a national trade publication.

Brother Allen is very active in his community and is currently serving on the Leawood, KS. Sustainability Commission as well as his third term as President of the Huntington Farms Homes Association. His involvement in his church include several volunteer positions. He is also one of the founding Board members of the Peoria Pacers minor league baseball team. Rick also established the Tom T. Moore General Scholarship, awarded annually to a deserving undergrad.

Brother Allen has also remained active in Fiji as a graduate Brother. He was a three term President of the Kansas City Graduate Chapter, Chaired the 1994 Ekklesia, held in Kansas City, which, at the time was the second best attended in Fiji history and the only profitable Ekklesia for the Educational Foundation. As a side note, Rick indicated the very first Fiji he met in Tucson, John Marietti, was the very first Fiji to support an Ekklesia with a paid sponsorship. In 1994 Rick received a Certificate of Appreciation from the Board of Archons as well as The Distinguished Fiji Award. In 1996 he served as an advisor to the organizing committee for the 1996 Ekklesia.

"Fiji Brotherhood is a cloak we proudly wear our entire lives regardless of contact or conversations. When you have received your Golden Owl, you have outlived some Brothers. In my case, both of my pledge sons, Bob Duncan and Bobby Coil, but you never outlive the closeness of your Fiji Brothers. There is a bond, like an unbroken chain, that bonds us for life. "Not for college days alone" is not a slogan, it is a Fact. Mighty is the pride we all have as recipients of what Phi Gamma Delta has given us."



Jim Webb '64

Jim Webb was initiated into Upsilon Alpha of Phi Gamma Delta in 1964. During his college years at University of Arizona, he served as the Upsilon Alpha Historian from '66-'67. To this day Jim said his closest friends are his fraternity brothers.

Not only is Jim an outstanding member of Phi Gamma Delta, he was also involved with Bobcats, he was the president of Traditions, and held a chair position for Associated Students of the University of Arizona.

Since his college years he has continued his involvement and leadership in serval ways. He has been the past presidents of Arizona National Livestock Show, Arizona Cattle Growers Association, National Cattlemen's Beef Board, University of Arizona Ag 100 Council, and Project Central, a rural leadership group. He is also a member of the Arizona Beef Council and was a member of the Arizona State Land Department Board of Appeals for 1992-2004.
